EU Mission on Cancer

Challenges

- 2.7 million people in the EU diagnosed each year
- 1.3 million people die from cancer each year
- Total cost of cancer in Europe in 2018: €199 billion
- Impact of Covid-19 pandemic, war in Ukraine

Objectives

- Understanding of cancer
- Prevention & early detection
- Diagnosis and treatment
- Quality of life



GOAL

Improve the lives of more than 3 million people by 2030, through prevention, cure and for those affected by cancer including their families, to live longer and better, jointly with the Europe's Beating Cancer Plan

<u>Understanding of cancer</u>: examples of actions foreseen

- Establish the 'UNCAN.eu' platform
- Better understand healthy versus cancer cells at individual and population level
- Better understand cancer-patient molecular, cell, organ, organismal interactions
- Determine the role of genetics in cancer





Prevention of cancer: examples of actions foreseen

- Conduct implementation research on cancer prevention
- Optimise and improve access to existing screening programmes
- Develop new methods and technologies for screening and early detection
- Develop early predictors/tests





Diagnostic and treatment: examples of actions foreseen

- Support the creation of a Network of Comprehensive Cancer Infrastructures, integrating research aspects
- Develop twinning programmes for capacity-building
- Develop a clinical trial programme on diagnostics
- Develop a clinical trial programme on treatments





Quality of life: examples of actions foreseen

- Collect and analyse data on today's unmet needs of cancer patients and survivors
- Develop early predictors for quality of life
- Set up of a European Cancer Patient Digital Centre




Role of regions, local communities

- Competencies for healthcare: e.g. creation of network of Comprehensive Cancer Infrastructures
- Smart Specialisation Strategies: health mentioned in 90%; Living labs exist in most Member States for end-user engagement.
- Many regional and interregional cancer projects supported through Cohesion Policy; several RRF plans mention cancer
- Project TRAMI: facilitate engagement of regional and local actors in support of EU-level or national activities to implement missions.
- Recent opinion of Committee of Regions on European Missions

Personalised Medicine in the RIS3 priorities

53 RIS3 out of the 135 analysed, explicitly prioritise **Personalised Medicine (38%)**

- No Personalised Medicine priority in the RIS3
- Personalised/stratified/precision Medicine priority in the RIS3
