Four general objectives represent the breath and the ambitions of the programme



Improve & foster health in the Union



Protect people from serious cross-border health threats



 Improve access to medicinal products, medical devices crisis-relevant products



Strengthen health systems

EUR 5.3 billion in current prices







EU4Health - Joint Action on Transfer of best practices in primary care

- Transfer and pilot implementation of best practices in primary care into new locations in a number of MS
- Practices already selected by MS, most coming from regional level:
 - > Integrated Health Association Region of Wallonia, Belgium
 - > TELEA: Home telemonitoring in Primary Care for chronic disease and Covid-19 Galicia, Spain
 - Integrated care for complex chronic patients in Andalusia (Spain): Personalized care action plans (PAPs) Andalusia, Spain
 - Essencial Project: Adding value to clinical primary care practice Catalonia, Spain
 - > 'Health Action for Children and Youth at Risk' & 'Health Action for Gender, Violence and Lifecycle' Portugal
 - Health Promotion Centres (HPCs) Slovenia





EU4Health - Joint Action on Transfer of best practices in primary care

- The 'owners' of the selected best practices will help other MS interested in adopting them
- Knowledge-transfer and "twinning" actions (e.g. policy dialogues, workshops, staff visits and secondments, expert advice, mutual and peer learning programmes, etc.).
- Pilots for the actual 'replication' of the best practices
- Reinforcing capacity of health authorities to transform primary care and strengthen health system resilience
- ☐ Many MS participating, starting to plan the technical work and pilots (expected at local/regional level)
- ☐ Kick-off after summer 2022; EC grant: EUR 10 million





EU4Health -health system resilience testing and support programme

- Developing a resilience testing methodology will facilitate better data, information and enable cross-country learning based on Opinion of Expert Panel and HSPA report.
- Methodology, pilots and training in collaboration with OECD and European Observatory of Health Systems and Policies
- Member States will be able to regularly review health crisis preparedness and check their health systems' resilience against specific high-pressure scenarios and long-term structural challenges
- Kick-off in 2022; EC grant: EUR 1.5 million





EU4Health - Joint Action on Health workforce forecasting and planning


- Complex challenges faced by EU healthcare systems even before COVID pandemic.
- COVID-19 pandemic reminded about the importance of an balanced/adequate numbers capacity, with the right skills and flexibility.
- Develop knowledge on data sets needed for more comprehensive health workforce planning
- Better use of tools for health workforce planning and its integration into financing models and organisation of health services, taking into account lessons learnt from the COVID-19
- Build MS' administrative capacity in effective forecasting and planning for health workforce Knowledge-transfer, "twinning" actions, workshops, mutual and peer learning programmes.
- Deadline for submitting the proposal 15 february 2022
- Kick-off after summer 2022; EC grant: EUR million



Health Programme - 2020 health workforce projects cluster

OBJECTIVES

Support health system reforms - focusing on workforce policies, access to care in disadvantaged areas and reorganization of care delivery.




Improved knowledge base for formulating and implementing reforms.

Recovery and Resilience Facility (RRF)



Each Recovery and Resilience Plan (RRP) has to include:





Health resilience is among the 6 main pillars of the RRF





Recovery and Resilience Facility and health

- Health resilience is among the 6 main pillars of the RRF.
- Recovery and Resilience Plans should allocate at least 20% of their budget to the digital transition: potential linkages to eHealth.
- RRPs should address the EU semester's country-specific recommendations (CSRs). In 2019, 16 Member States received CSRs addressing health system reform. In 2020, for the first time, all 27 Member States received a CSR on health, focusing on resilience





Recovery and Resilience Facility: expenditures on health

- All endorsed RRPs to date have measures related to health.
- For the 22 endorsed RRPs around EUR 40 billion is proposed to be spent on health investments and reforms (including measures outside of healthcare, but with a clear medical component, such as long-term care).
- Grants requested for health-related measures make up around 10% of all grants under the RRF.





RRF - Examples of investments (health system preparedness)

- Czechia Establishment and development of the Centre for Cancer Prevention and Infrastructure for Innovative and Supportive Care at the Masaryk Oncology Institute
- Cyprus Innovative Public Health information and communications technology (ICT) System
- Germany Special programme to accelerate research and development of urgently needed vaccines against SARS-CoV-2





RRF: State of Play (08 Dec 2021)

- 26 RRPs formally submitted (Netherlands not submitted yet)
- 22 RRPs have been adopted by the Council and Commission Council (Poland, Hungary, Sweden and Bulgaria pending)
- 18 Member State already received their RRF pre-financing disbursements (13%)
- 2 Member States (Spain and France) made their first payment request
- Recovery and Resilience Facility Scoreboard (website with data and analysis)
 to be launched still this month
