The context

- Border areas are home to **40% of the European population**.
- The **socio-economic development** of border regions is often **hampered** because of their **peripheral location** and the differences in legislation compared to their neighbouring countries.
- Border regions experience hindrance of free movement of labour and services which leads to disadvantages in the economic, social and cultural development. All these factors significantly affect healthcare systems in border regions.
- The geographical working area for enterprises and their markets, healthcare providers and institutions, skills and training services for the workforce, educational institutions and regional governments often encounter more obstacles than in non-border regions, which makes the delivery of health care services less efficient.
- Furthermore, citizens are **limited in their choice of and accessibility to health care and there is less room for cooperation**, which can potentially create **health inequalities**

Topics:

- 1. Acknowledge diversity and bottom-up initiatives
- 2. Recognition of professional qualifications and skills
- 3. Find innovative financing and payment mechanisms
- 4. Coordination of health services and investments
- 5. Strengthening National Contact Points
- 6. Support ECBM (European Cross-Border Mechanism)
- 7. Value-Based healthcare
- 8. Data Management



The roadmap

- Discussing the first draft of the Joint statement and collecting inputs during EUREGHA's General Assembly and study visit in Lower Austria, 13th of March
- Organising a dedicated meeting of the European Committee of the Regions' Interregional Group on Health and Well-being, to collect inputs from CoR members (26 June)
- Working within the already-established internal Working Group on Crossborder healthcare
- Maximising the impact of the Joint statement through the recently-launched EUREGHA campaign "<u>Health in all Regions</u>" and the future <u>EU health</u> <u>Summit (January 2020)</u>
