

An hampered socio-economic development because of their peripheral location Hindrance of free movement of labour and services that affect healthcare systems

Citizens are **limited in their choice of** and **accessibility to healthcare** and there is less room for cooperation More obstacles for enterprises, healthcare providers and institutions, training services for the workforce, educational institutions and regional governments.





2. Recognition of professional qualifications and skills


- Facilitation of recognition and administrative burden
